

## SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR

The Scholarship Committee of the Area Credit Union Outreach Alliance (CACUOA) invites you to apply for a scholarship. There will be at least nine scholarships awarded at \$1,000 each. To qualify, you must be at least a senior in a local high school and plan to enroll in post-high school studies, including vocational, professional and academic studies, which are not limited to colleges and universities. Applicants may also be anyone who is obtaining an Associate or Bachelor Degree. <u>You yourself must be a primary member</u> of an Ohio Credit Union that has branches in one of the Cincinnati area counties to be eligible. (Cincinnati Area Counties are: Hamilton, Butler, Warren, Clermont, Brown, and Adams.)
